

Following their recent Virtual Reality Hackathon held in Melbourne in Aug 2016, (the first of its kind in Australia), Dr Mark Ziembecki and Dr Ian McLeod present an inspiring workshop encompassing cutting edge technology and how to create inspiring science-based media content. One of the aims of the VRH is to explore the potential of using virtual reality to educate and inspire people about protection of the Great Barrier Reef.

Ross will discuss what went on behind the scenes to bring *Beneath Hill 60* to the screen. The efforts of pulling resources together and raising funds within Townsville while complying with all environmental, health and safety requirements and the rights of the public. How to make a 360 video




